

2.7 Timothy Nauman slid to a stop right beside Plaintiff's truck. He was still ordering the Plaintiff to "get his felony ass out of that truck." The Plaintiff did not want to get maced again by his brother, so the Plaintiff told his son, Joshua, to just drive slowly forward, get on the grade leaving the field, and leave. As soon as Joshua started to go forward, Timothy Nauman put the State of Washington van in reverse in an attempt to prevent Plaintiff and his son from leaving the field. Joshua sped up, but so did Timothy Nauman. Very quickly speeds of 25-30 mph were reached. Joshua was trying to avoid hitting the encroaching fir trees on the right side of the truck. He did not notice that Timothy Nauman had actually turned the State of Washington van at an angle and was attempting to ram the rear end of the van into the front of the Defendant's truck. The Plaintiff saw this happening in disbelief and quickly told Joshua to slam on the brakes. Joshua did so and slid to a stop. Their truck missed hitting the State of Washington van by less than a foot. Had Joshua not stopped so quickly, The State of Washington van driven by Timothy Nauman would have crashed into the left side engine block area of the truck, or worst yet, into the left side driver's door, potentially causing harm to Plaintiff's son, Joshua.

2.8 Timothy Nauman quickly backed up and then pulled forward right in front of Plaintiff's and Joshua's truck blocking any way for Plaintiff and his son to exit. They were blocked by the trees they had hit on the right side and behind them, and The State of Washington van was so close to their front bumper they could not turn to the left to attempt to exit. Plaintiff immediately took pictures of being detained and then turned on the cell phone video. In a mocking manner, the Timothy Nauman started to cell phone video record the Plaintiff and his son. The Plaintiff feared to exit their truck because, as stated above, Timothy Nauman had pulled a harsh prank on his birthday by macing his younger brother (The Plaintiff) for
