Section #: 1 Reasons: Jeanine Carolyn Traylor's residency is listed as being in Lewis County, WA when it is in Yuma County, AZ where she is stationed as a US Customs Agent, a fact known to the petitioner, Braxton Grey Traylor

Section #: 4 Reasons: The date and reason for the end of the marriage is listed as "5/31/2022, which is when one of us moved to a separate household."
